## Description

Provide a short description of the event and its activities.

The town twinning event was organized in Ocland, Harghita county, Romania, between the 27th of April and 1st of May. It included delegations from 3 countries (Romania, Hungary, Croatia) and 7 localities.

The main aim of the project was to develop the active attitude, citizenship, and

social competences of the 350 participants, thus this way making them more responsible European Union citizens, strengthening the sense of belonging to Europe, by promoting debates about its current challenges, possible future and raising awareness of the importance of strengthening the European integration process based on solidarity.

The young people taking part at the event also got to know the opportunities of European Solidarity Corps programme, volunteering opportunities. It was also a cultural exchange, as all the delegations presented their folk dances, sang their traditional songs, made their national dishes, and overall shared insights into their respective cultures.

The activities included 6 round-table discussions about the present challenges Europe faces, how the delegations could improve their communities, Covid19 etc. Besides this, through the 4 workshops and 8 presentations, the 170 members of the delegations now better understand the decision-making processes that are taking place in the EU. By the 5 intercultural activities the participants are more prone to accept cultural differences, cherishing them, making them aware of the importance of preserving their own cultural identity, how this maintains the multicultural European community. On the last day of the event, the delegations made collaboration plans for the future, in order to better their communities by forming synergies between themselves.
